“Father God, I withdraw all judgments I have made against all people and entities. I hereby forgive, bless, and release all those who may have hurt or injured me. Thank you Father God for totally forgiving me of all of my sins. In Jesus Christ's Name, I pray. Amen.”

The **third** thing you must do every day is to **put on The Full Armor Of God, while being strong in The Lord, and in the power of His Might:**

“Father God, I thank you for this day, and I put on The Full Armor Of God. I put on The Belt Of Truth, The Breastplate Of Righteousness, My feet are shod with the readiness of The Gospel Of Peace. Also, I put on The Shield Of Faith, with which I can extinguish all the fiery darts of the evil one, The Helmet Of Salvation, and The Sword Of The Spirit, which is The Word Of God. In Jesus Christ's Name, I pray. Amen.”

“Father God, thank you for assigning and sending to me today, Your Holy Angels that Glorify You, to help me carry out my assignments for you. Give Your Angels strength, resources, power, and wisdom to carry out all Your Instructions concerning me. Thank you that Your Holy Angels minister to me, guide me, help me, encourage me, bless me, protect me, and fight on my behalf. In Jesus Christ's Name, I pray. Amen.”

CREATED TO LIVE IN GOD'S PRESENCE AND GLORY

From the very beginning, humanity was never designed to live separated, striving, empty, or disconnected from God. Man was not created to search endlessly for meaning, nor to struggle through life without divine help. You were created for something far greater—something higher, something eternal, something filled with power, purpose, and fullness.

You were created to **live in God's Presence** and to **walk in His Glory**.

This is the original design of your life.

When God formed man, He did not place him into a world of distance and separation. He placed him into **His Presence**. The first man lived in direct fellowship with God, not visiting occasionally, but abiding continually. “Thou wilt shew me the path of life: in thy presence is fulness of joy; at thy right hand there are pleasures for evermore.” (Psalm 16:11)

Notice the language—**fulness of joy**. Not partial joy. Not temporary joy. Not joy based on circumstances. **Fullness**.

This **fulness** is not something you manufacture. **It is something you experience when you are living in His Presence—and it is sustained when you live in His Glory.**

with joy, and **Your Joy** become my strength. I surrender my independence, and **choose to depend on You** completely. Lead me into a life that reflects Your Glory continually. In The Name Of Jesus Christ.

PRACTICAL APPLICATION

Begin today by practicing awareness of God in simple moments. Pause throughout your day, and acknowledge His Presence. **Choose to align your thoughts with His Word when distractions arise. Speak words that agree with Scripture rather than circumstances.** Make a conscious decision to depend on Him instead of yourself. As you do, you will begin to move from occasional awareness, into a **continuous life in His Presence —and from His Presence into the reality of His Glory.**

WHAT THE GLORY OF GOD TRULY IS

Many speak about the **glory of God**, yet few truly understand what it is—or how it is meant to be lived in. For many, the **glory of God** is reduced to a feeling, a moment in worship, or an unexplained spiritual atmosphere. It is treated as something distant, mysterious, and occasional.

But the **glory of God** is not distant. It is not reserved for rare moments. It is not meant to be experienced only in certain places.

The glory of God is the manifested reality of who God is.

It is **His Presence revealed, His Nature expressed, His Power made visible, and His Goodness experienced**. It is what happens when God is no longer merely believed in—but **encountered, known, and lived with**.

He asked to see **God’s Glory**.

God’s response reveals what His Glory truly is:

“And he said, I will make all my goodness pass before thee, and I will proclaim the name of the LORD before thee...” (Exodus 33:19)

This is profound.

Teach me to live in alignment with You, so that Your Nature, Your Goodness, and Your Power are expressed in my life. Let me not settle for moments, when You have called me to a lifestyle. Draw me deeper into Your Presence, and establish me in Your Glory. Transform my thinking, my speaking, and my living, so that I reflect You more clearly every day. In The Name Of Jesus Christ.

PRACTICAL APPLICATION

Take time today to meditate on **who God Is**, not just what He does. Read Scripture and focus on His Character—His Goodness, His Faithfulness, His Power. As you go through your day, consciously align your words with what is true about God, rather than what you feel or see. Refuse to reduce God's Glory to a moment—choose to **live aware of Him** continually. **Begin to see yourself not as someone trying to reach God, but as someone invited to live in His Presence and express His Glory.**

WHY LIFE WITHOUT GOD'S GLORY IS EMPTY

There is a deep emptiness in the human soul that nothing in this world can satisfy. People spend their lives searching—pursuing success, relationships, possessions, recognition, and experiences—yet even when they attain these things, something still remains missing.

That missing reality is not a thing. It is not a goal. It is not a feeling.

It is the **glory of God**.

Man was **never** created to be fulfilled by the world. He was created to be **fulfilled by God**. And not just by knowing about God—but by living in His Presence and walking in **His Glory**. When that reality is absent, emptiness is inevitable.

This is why **no amount of achievement can replace what is lost** when a person **lives disconnected from God's Glory**. You can fill your schedule, your mind, and even your life with activity—but without His Presence, there will always be a void.

God describes Himself as **the fountain of living waters—the source of life, refreshment, and continual supply**. When people turn away from Him, **they attempt to create their own sources**. But these sources are broken. They cannot hold what they promise.

They cannot sustain life.

This is the emptiness of life without God’s Glory.

You can pour everything into your own efforts, your own plans, your own pursuits—but **without Him**, it will not satisfy. It cannot hold what your soul was designed to receive.

Because your soul was created for God.

It was created to live in His Presence, to be filled with His Joy, to be strengthened by His Life, and to be sustained by His Glory.

This is why the **absence of God** produces more than emptiness—it produces **weakness**.

“The joy of the LORD is your strength.” (Nehemiah 8:10)

If joy is found in His Presence, then outside of His Presence, **that strength is absent**. What remains is strain, effort, and exhaustion. Life becomes something you must carry, instead of something that carries you.

This is the hidden burden of **living outside of God’s Glory**.

You are forced to rely on yourself.

You must generate your own strength.

You must sustain your own peace.

You must create your own sense of purpose.

But you were never designed to live this way.

You were created to live from God—not apart from Him.

And this is why the answer to emptiness is **not found in doing more—it is found in returning to Him**.

Returning to His Presence.

Returning to alignment with His Word.

Returning to the life of abiding.

Because where His Presence is, fullness is restored.

“Thou wilt shew me the path of life: in thy presence is fulness of joy...” (Psalm 16:11)

Notice that it says **fulness of joy**—not partial, not temporary, not dependent on circumstances. **Fullness.**

This is what the world cannot give.

The world offers temporary satisfaction, but **only God provides fullness.** The world offers distraction, but **God provides reality.** The world offers substitutes, but **God provides the source.**

And this **fulness** is not something you must chase—it **is something you enter when you return to Him.**

When you align with God, the emptiness begins to disappear—not because circumstances change immediately, but because your source has changed. You are no longer drawing from yourself—you are drawing from Him.

And when you draw from Him, everything changes.

Strength replaces weakness.

Peace replaces striving.

Joy replaces emptiness.

Clarity replaces confusion.

This is the **restoration of the Glory Life.**

But this restoration is not automatic—it is **a choice.**

You must choose to turn from independence to dependence.

You must choose to align your life with God’s Word.

You must choose to remain aware of His Presence.

This is how **the flow of His Glory** is restored in your life.

And when that flow is restored, you begin to experience what Jesus Christ made possible:

**“I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me.”
(Philippians 4:13)**

This is not the language of striving—it is the language of **connection**. It is the result of **living from Jesus Christ, not apart from Him**.

The emptiness of life without God is replaced by the **fullness** of life in Him.

This is not a distant promise.

This is a present reality for those who choose to live in His Presence and walk in His Glory.

You were never meant to live empty.

You were created to **live full—full of His Presence, full of His Joy, full of His Life, and full of His Glory.**

DECLARATION

I refuse to live apart from God’s Presence and Glory. I was not created to be empty, but to be filled with **His Life**. **I choose to abide in Him, to align my life with His Word**, and to live from **His Fullness**. **The joy of the Lord is my strength**, and His Presence satisfies my soul. **Apart from Him I can do nothing, but through Jesus Christ I can do all things**. I live in His Glory, and my life is **filled with His Power and Presence**. In The Name Of Jesus Christ.

PRAYER

Father God, I thank You for revealing that I was never meant to live without You. **Forgive me** for the times I have tried to live independently, **relying on my own strength and understanding**. Draw me back into **Your Presence and establish me in Your Glory**. Fill my life with Your Joy, strengthen me with Your Presence, and teach me **to abide in You continually**. Let my life **be sustained by You**, and not by the things of this world. **I choose to live in the fullness that only You can provide**. In The Name Of Jesus Christ.

PRACTICAL APPLICATION

Take time today to identify areas where you have been relying on yourself instead of God. **Acknowledge those areas before Him, and choose to realign with His Word.** When feelings of emptiness or pressure arise, **do not try to solve them through distraction—return your focus to God’s Presence. Speak Scripture out loud** and remind yourself that your life is sustained by Him. Begin to shift your dependence from your own effort to God’s Strength, and you will begin to experience the **fullness that comes from living in His Glory.**

JESUS CHRIST: THE DOOR INTO THE GLORY LIFE

No one enters the **Glory Life** by effort, discipline, or desire alone. No one reaches God's Presence through striving, nor **walks in His Glory** through human ability. **There is only one way into this life**—one door, one access point, one foundation.

That way is Jesus Christ.

The **Glory Life** does not begin with what you do. **It begins with who you receive.** It begins with entering into relationship with God through His Son, and from **that relationship** flows everything else—presence, joy, strength, alignment, and glory.

Jesus Christ did not come merely to improve your life. He came to restore you to the life you were created for—**a life in God's Presence and Glory.**

He made this truth unmistakably clear:

“I am the door: by me if any man enter in, he shall be saved, and shall go in and out, and find pasture.” (John 10:9)

He did not say He was a door. He said **He is the door.**

This means there is **no alternate path. No other access. No other way to enter into the fullness of what God has prepared. Every attempt to reach God outside of Jesus Christ leads to limitation, distance, and ultimately emptiness.**

But through Him, everything is opened.

Through Him, access is restored.

Through Him, relationship is reestablished.

Through Him, the Glory Life becomes possible.

This is why Jesus Christ also declared:

“I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me.” (John 14:6)

The **Glory Life** is not about discovering a system—it is about entering into a relationship. And that relationship is only made possible through **Jesus Christ**.

When sin entered the world, it did more than bring failure—it brought separation. It separated man from God’s Presence and removed him from the fullness of His Glory. What was once natural became distant. What was once constant became inaccessible.

But Jesus Christ came to remove that separation.

Through His Death and Resurrection, He did not merely forgive sin—He restored access to God. He reopened the way into His Presence, and made it possible for every Christian Believer to live in His Glory once again.

Scripture reveals this restoration clearly:

“Having therefore, brethren, boldness to enter into the holiest by the blood of Jesus.” (Hebrews 10:19)

Notice the word **boldness**.

You are not meant to approach God hesitantly, uncertainly, or distantly. Through Jesus Christ, you have been given **bold** access into His Presence—the very place where His Glory is revealed.

This is not earned. **It is given.**

This is not achieved. **It is received.**

And this **changes everything about how you live.**

You are no longer trying to reach God—you are invited to abide in Him. You are no longer striving to get closer—you have been brought near. You are no longer separated—you have been restored.

This is the **doorway into the Glory Life.**

But entering through the **door** is only the beginning.

Many have entered into salvation, but have not stepped fully into the life that salvation makes possible. They have received forgiveness, but

have not embraced fellowship. They have accepted truth, but have not aligned their lives with it. They have come to the door—but have not walked into the fullness beyond it.

Jesus Christ did not just open the door—He invites you to live inside what He has opened.

He revealed this when He said:

“Abide in me, and I in you.” (John 15:4)

The Glory Life is not about visiting Jesus Christ—it is about abiding in Him. It is about living in continual relationship, continual dependence, continual awareness.

This is where the glory is experienced—not at the doorway, but in the abiding.

When you abide in Jesus Christ, His Life begins to flow through you. His Presence becomes constant. His Joy becomes your strength. His Power becomes your ability. His Word becomes your foundation.

And this flow produces fruit.

Not forced fruit, not manufactured fruit—but natural fruit that comes from connection.

Because the branch does not struggle to produce fruit—it remains connected to the vine.

And Jesus Christ made this clear:

“He that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit.” (John 15:5)

This is the Glory Life in motion.

It is not driven by effort—it is sustained by connection. It is not produced by striving—it flows from abiding. It is not built on human strength—it is empowered by divine life.

This is why apart from Him, nothing works as it should.

Without Him, life becomes effort.

Without Him, strength fades.

Without Him, purpose becomes unclear.

But in Him, everything changes.

Because in Him, you are no longer limited to yourself.

**“I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me.”
(Philippians 4:13)**

This is not a statement of human ability—it is a declaration of divine dependence. It is the reality of a life lived in Christ, strengthened by Him, empowered through Him.

This is what it means **to live in His Glory.**

The **Glory Life** is not something you create—it is something you enter through Jesus Christ, and live out through continual abiding.

This is why everything in your life must flow from Him.

Your **strength** must come from Him.

Your **words** must align with Him.

Your **faith** must be rooted in Him.

Because the moment **you step out of dependence, you step out of flow.**

The moment you rely on yourself, you disconnect from the source. But the moment you **return to Him**, the flow of His Presence and Glory is restored.

This is the simplicity and the power of the **Glory Life.**

It is not complicated—it is relational.

It is not distant—it is available.

It is not reserved—it is open to all who come through Jesus Christ.

And the invitation remains:

Enter through the door.

Abide in Him.

Live in His Presence.

Walk in His Glory.

This is the life you were created for.

DECLARATION

Jesus Christ is the door into the Glory Life, and I have entered through Him. I abide in Him, and His Life flows through me. I do not live by my own strength, **but by His Power working in me**. I have bold access into God's Presence, and **I live in His Glory continually. Apart from Him I can do nothing, but through Him I can do all things**. My life is aligned with Him, and His Presence and Power are active in me every moment. In The Name Of Jesus Christ.

PRAYER

Father, I thank You for sending Jesus Christ as **the way** into Your Presence and Glory. **Thank You** that through Him, I have access to You. Teach me to **abide in Him continually, and to depend on Him** in every area of my life. Help me **to live from the reality** of this relationship, not just the knowledge of it. Let **Your Presence be constant** in my life and Your Glory be revealed through me. **Strengthen me through Jesus Christ, and lead me into a faithful deeper, daily walk with You. In The Name Of Jesus Christ.**

PRACTICAL APPLICATION

Take time today to consciously acknowledge **your dependence on Jesus Christ**. Begin your day by recognizing that He is your source, not yourself. When faced with decisions, challenges, or pressures, pause and turn your attention to Him, instead of reacting in your own strength. **Speak Scripture that affirms your connection to Him. Practice abiding, by maintaining awareness of Him throughout your day**. As you do, you will begin to experience the flow of His Presence and the reality of His Glory in your life.

BECOMING AWARE OF GOD’S PRESENCE AND GLORY

The **Glory Life** begins with **awareness**.

Not occasional awareness.

Not distant acknowledgment.

But a continual, living awareness of God’s Presence and His Glory in every moment.

Many Believers truly love God, yet they live most of their day unaware of Him. Their attention is captured by responsibilities, pressures, stress, distractions, and circumstances. God is not absent—but **He is not actively acknowledged.**

And where there is **no awareness**, there is **no experience**.

God’s Presence does not come and go—but your awareness of Him does. The **Glory Life** is not about getting God to come closer—it is about **waking up to the reality that He is already near.**

Scripture reveals this truth clearly:

“For in him we live, and move, and have our being...” (Acts 17:28)

This is **reality**.

You are **not living apart from God’s Sustaining Presence**. You are living within it. Your very existence is upheld by Him. Yet without **awareness**, this **truth remains unrealized in daily life.**

The **Glory Life** begins **when awareness becomes intentional.**

When you begin **to recognize that God is present—not just in spiritual moments, but in every moment—you begin to shift from living independently, to living consciously connected.**

This awareness is not passive—it must **be cultivated.**

It requires a **turning of attention.**

Your mind will naturally drift toward what is seen, what is urgent, and what demands immediate response. But the Glory Life calls you to develop a higher awareness—an awareness of what is unseen, yet more real than anything visible.

Scripture instructs this shift:

“While we look not at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen: for the things which are seen are temporal; but the things which are not seen are eternal.” (2 Corinthians 4:18)

To live in God’s Glory, you must learn to look beyond what is visible, and become aware of what is eternal.

This does not mean ignoring your responsibilities—it means living in them with a different awareness. It means recognizing that God is present in the middle of your day, in the middle of your work, in the middle of your decisions, and in the middle of your circumstances.

He is not waiting for a special moment—**He is already there.**

The difference between those who occasionally experience God and those who live in His Glory is awareness.

One **visits.**

The other lives **aware.**

This awareness is not based on feeling. There will be moments when you feel nothing—but God is still present. The Glory Life is not built on emotional sensitivity—it is **built on truth.**

“God is a Spirit: and they that worship him must worship him in spirit and in truth.” (John 4:24)

Truth establishes awareness, even when feelings do not confirm it.

You do not become aware of God because you feel Him—you become aware of Him because His Word reveals that He is present.

This is why **awareness** must be anchored in Scripture, not emotion.

When you rely on feelings, your awareness will rise and fall. **But when you rely on truth, your awareness becomes steady and consistent.**

God has promised His Presence:

“I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee.” (Hebrews 13:5)

Never means never.

Not when you feel strong.

Not when you feel weak.

Not when you are focused.

Not when you are distracted.

He does not leave—your **awareness** does.

The **Glory Life** is the practice of **returning your awareness to Him again and again**, until it becomes your **natural state**.

This is where **transformation** begins.

When you become aware of God, your thinking begins to change. You no longer think independently—you think in light of His Presence. You begin to **recognize** that He is with you, guiding you, strengthening you, and working through you.

Your words begin to change. You no longer speak from fear or reaction—you **speak from alignment with His Word**.

Your responses begin to change. Instead of reacting to circumstances, you respond from **a place of awareness that God is present and active**.

And from this awareness, the **Glory Life** begins to emerge.

You begin to **live** differently—not because your environment has changed, but because your **awareness** has changed.

You are no longer living alone.

You are no longer relying on yourself.

You are no longer reacting to life without God.

You are **living aware of Him**.

And in that **awareness**, everything begins to shift.

This is where the **Glory Life** begins—not in striving, not in effort, but in **awareness**.

And as awareness becomes consistent, you will begin to move beyond simply knowing God is present... **into living in the reality of His Glory**.

DECLARATION

God is with me, and I live aware of His Presence every moment. I acknowledge Him in all my ways, and He directs my life. My awareness of God is increasing, and I live from the reality of His Presence and Glory. His Presence fills me with joy, and His Joy is my strength. I do not depend on feelings—I stand on the truth of His Word. I live continually aware of Him, and His Glory is active in my life. In The Name Of Jesus Christ.

PRAYER

Father God, I thank You that You are always with me. Teach me to become continually aware of Your Presence in every moment of my life. Help me to turn my attention to You throughout my day, and to acknowledge You in all that I do. Strengthen my awareness through Your Word, and establish me in the truth that You never leave me. Let Your Presence become real to me in a deeper way, and lead me into a life that is fully aware of You, and filled with Your Glory. In The Name Of Jesus Christ.

PRACTICAL APPLICATION

Begin today by intentionally acknowledging God at specific moments—when you wake up, before decisions, during conversations, and in times of pressure. Pause and remind yourself that He is present. **Speak Scripture out loud** to anchor your awareness in truth. When your mind drifts into distraction, or worry, gently bring your focus back to God. Practice this consistently, and your awareness will grow stronger. As your **awareness** increases, you will begin to experience the reality of His Presence—and from that **awareness**, you will begin to live in **His Glory**.

IN HIS PRESENCE IS FULNESS OF JOY

There is a **joy** that the world cannot produce, cannot sustain, and cannot understand. It does not come from circumstances, achievements, or outward success. It is not dependent on what is happening around you, nor is it diminished by what is happening against you.

This **joy** comes from one place alone.

It flows from **the presence of God**.

This is a **revealed truth**:

“Thou wilt shew me the path of life: in thy presence is fulness of joy; at thy right hand there are pleasures for evermore.” (Psalm 16:11)

Notice the certainty of this statement. It does not say that **joy** might be found in His Presence. It does not say that **joy** is sometimes experienced. **It declares that in His Presence there is fullness of joy.**

Fullness means complete. Lacking nothing. Not partial, not temporary, not fluctuating—**full**.

This is the **joy** of the **Glory Life**.

Many Believers live far below this reality, because they have learned to look for joy in the **wrong** places. They look to circumstances, relationships, progress, or outcomes to produce what **only God’s Presence can supply**. And when those things shift—as they always do—their joy rises and falls with them.

But the **joy of The Lord** does not rise and fall.

It remains.

Because it is not rooted in what changes—it is **rooted in He who does not change**.

God’s Presence is constant, and therefore the **joy** found in His Presence is available continually. The issue is not the availability of **joy**—the issue is

awareness and **alignment**. When you live **aware** of God and **aligned** with His Word, you position yourself to experience what is already present.

This is why **joy** is not something you must chase—**it is something you enter into**.

You do not create it.

You do not earn it.

You do not manufacture it.

You experience it, when you **live in His Presence** and **walk in His Glory**.

This **joy** is deeper than emotion.

Emotion reacts.

Joy remains.

Emotion is influenced by circumstances.

Joy flows from God.

Emotion can be unstable.

Joy is rooted in Truth.

This is why the **Glory Life** is not built on emotional experience—it is built on **spiritual reality**. You may not always feel joyful, but when you are aware of God's Presence, you can access the **joy** that is already there.

And this **joy** is not passive—it is **powerful**.

“The joy of the LORD is your strength.” (Nehemiah 8:10)

Joy is not just a feeling—it is a **source of strength**.

This changes how you understand strength. Strength is not simply endurance or effort. It is not the ability to push through difficulty by your own will. True strength flows from the **joy** that comes from God's Presence.

When you are living in His Presence, you are not drawing from your own resources—you are **drawing from His**.

This is why **joy strengthens you**.

It stabilizes your thinking.
It steadies your heart.
It sustains your endurance.

When **joy** is present, weakness loses its grip. When **joy** flows, discouragement cannot take root. When **joy** fills your life, you are no longer controlled by what is happening around you.

But many have learned to live without this strength because they have learned to live without consistent awareness of God's Presence. They move in and out of awareness, and as a result, they move in and out of joy.

But the **Glory Life** calls you into something higher—something more consistent, more stable, more real.

It calls you to live where **joy** is not occasional, but **continual**.

This does not mean that challenges disappear. It means that **your source does not change**. You may face pressure, but you are not overcome by it. You may encounter difficulty, but you are **not defined by it**.

Because your **strength** is not coming from your situation—it is **coming from God**.

Jesus Christ revealed the connection between His Presence and His Joy:

“These things have I spoken unto you, that my joy might remain in you, and that your joy might be full.” (John 15:11)

Notice the language again—**remain** and **full**.

Joy is meant to remain. It is meant to stay. It is meant to be sustained. And it is meant to be **full**—not lacking, not diminished, not incomplete.

This is only possible through **abiding**.

When you abide in Jesus Christ, His Joy remains in you. When you live aware of Him, aligned with Him, and dependent on Him, **His Joy becomes your continual reality**.

This is not something distant—it is something available now.

But it requires a **shift**.

You must stop looking outward for what is found inward in God's Presence. You must **stop allowing circumstances** to dictate your internal state. **You must choose to anchor your life in the unchanging reality of God's Presence.**

This joy is not fragile—it is resilient. It does not collapse under pressure—it rises above it. It does not disappear in difficulty—it **sustains** you through it.

Because it is not your joy—it is **His**.

And **His Joy** does not fail.

The more you live in His Presence, the more natural this **joy** becomes. It becomes your baseline, not your exception. It becomes your **strength**, not your struggle. It becomes your reality, not your pursuit.

This is what it means **to live in His Glory**.

It means that even in the middle of life's demands, pressures, and responsibilities, there is a steady flow of **joy** within you—a **joy** that **strengthens** you, carries you, and anchors you in God.

This is not reserved for a few.

This is the inheritance of every Christian Believer **who chooses to live aware of God's Presence, and aligned with His Word.**

And as you step into this, you will begin to experience what Scripture declares—as your life:

In His Presence is fullness of joy.

DECLARATION

I live in God's Presence, and His Joy fills my life completely. His Joy is my strength, and I am sustained by Him. I do not depend on circumstances for joy—I draw from the presence of God. His Joy remains in me, and my joy is full. **I live in His Glory**, and His Strength flows through me continually. In The Name Of Jesus Christ.

PRAYER

Father, I thank You that in Your Presence there is fullness of joy. **Teach me to live continually aware of You**, so that I can experience this joy in every moment. **Help me to stop looking to circumstances for what only You can provide. Strengthen me through Your Joy, and establish me in Your Presence. Let Your Joy remain in me, and become the source of my strength each day. I choose to live in Your Presence and walk in Your Glory.** In The Name Of Jesus Christ.

PRACTICAL APPLICATION

Throughout your day, take moments to pause and refocus your attention on God. When you feel pressure, discouragement, or distraction, do not try to force a change—**return your awareness to His Presence. Speak**

Scripture out loud, and remind yourself that joy is found in Him. Choose to align your thoughts with **truth** rather than circumstances. As you practice this consistently, you will begin to experience a steady flow of joy that strengthens you, and anchors you in the reality of His Presence and Glory.

THE JOY OF THE LORD IS YOUR STRENGTH

There is a **strength** that does not come from human effort.

It is not produced by determination, sustained by discipline, or maintained by willpower. It does not depend on how you feel, how much rest you have had, or how favorable your circumstances may be.

This strength comes from God.

And Scripture reveals exactly where it is found:

“The joy of the LORD is your strength.” (Nehemiah 8:10)

This is a spiritual law.

If you understand this, you will begin to live differently. If you apply this, you will begin to experience a level of stability, endurance, and power that cannot be explained by natural means.

**Strength flows from joy.
And joy flows from God’s Presence.**

This means that **strength** is not something you must strive to create—it is **something you receive when you live in alignment with God, and remain aware of His Presence.**

Many Christian Believers try to be strong without understanding this connection. They attempt to endure through pressure, push through difficulty, and overcome challenges by drawing from their own resources. But eventually, that strength **runs out.**

Because human strength has limits.

It becomes tired.

It becomes discouraged.

It becomes overwhelmed.

But the strength that comes from God’s Joy does not fail—because it is not your strength.

It is His.

This is the difference between **striving** and **abiding**.

When you strive, you rely on yourself.

When you abide, you draw from God.

And when you draw from God, you are no longer limited to what you can produce.

This is why joy is not optional in the Glory Life—it is essential.

Without joy, strength weakens.

Without joy, endurance fades.

Without joy, clarity diminishes.

But when **joy** is present, **strength** rises.

This is why the enemy continually attempts to steal your joy. If your joy is removed, your strength is weakened. If your joy is disrupted, your stability is shaken.

Scripture reveals this strategy clearly:

**“The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy...”
(John 10:10)**

One of the primary things **the enemy seeks to steal is your joy**. He does this through distraction, discouragement, fear, pressure, and misalignment with God’s Word.

If he can shift your focus away from God’s Presence, **he can interrupt the flow of joy**—and when joy is interrupted, **strength begins to decline**.

This is why **guarding your joy** is not optional—it is **necessary**.

You must recognize that your **joy** is not dependent on what is happening around you. It is rooted in what is happening **within you**—your connection **to God**.

When your **awareness** is anchored in Him, **joy** remains.

When your **focus shifts away from Him, joy fades.**

But the moment you return your attention to God, the flow of joy is restored—not because something external has changed, but because **you have reconnected with the source.**

This is how **strength is renewed.**

Scripture describes this renewal:

“But they that wait upon the LORD shall renew their strength...”
(Isaiah 40:31)

Waiting upon the Lord is not passive—it is **relational**. It is the act of turning your attention toward Him, remaining aware of His Presence, and **aligning yourself with His Reality.**

When you do this, strength is renewed—not gradually, but **supernaturally.**

This is the **power** of the **Glory Life.**

You are not living from your own strength—**you are living from His.** And because His strength does not fail, you are sustained even in the middle of pressure, difficulty, and challenge.

This does not mean that you will never feel pressure. **It means that pressure will not overcome you.**

Because **your strength** is not coming from your circumstances—**it is coming from God.**

Jesus Christ revealed **the source of this strength:**

“These things have I spoken unto you, that my joy might remain in you, and that your joy might be full.” (John 15:11)

His Joy.

Not a temporary emotion. Not a fluctuating feeling. **His Joy**—placed within you, remaining in you, and producing **fullness.**

This is the **strength** of the **Glory Life.**

When you live in God's Presence, His Joy becomes your internal environment. It steadies you. It anchors you. It empowers you.

Even when everything around you is shifting, there is a stability within you that does not move.

This is not natural—it is supernatural.

And it **flows** from **abiding**.

When **you abide in Jesus Christ**, you remain connected to the source of **joy**. When **you remain aware of God's Presence**, you remain positioned to **receive His Strength**.

But when you disconnect—when your attention shifts, when your words fall out of alignment, when your focus turns to circumstances—you begin to draw from yourself again.

And when you draw from yourself, strength fades.

This is why **alignment** is essential.

Your thoughts must align with God's Truth.

Your words must agree with His Word.

Your focus must return to His Presence.

This is how you **remain in the flow of joy**—and therefore, in **the flow of strength**.

The **Glory Life** is not about avoiding challenges—it is **about living with a strength that overcomes them**.

It is about walking through life not weakened by pressure, but strengthened by **God's Presence**.

It is about living from a place where your internal condition is **not** controlled by external conditions.

This is **the strength** that comes **from joy**.

And this joy is always available—because God’s Presence is always available.

The key is **awareness**.

When you are **aware of Him, joy flows.**

When **joy flows, strength rises.**

When **strength rises, you stand firm.**

This is the life you were created to **live.**

Not weak, not unstable, not overwhelmed—but **strong, steady, and sustained by God.**

And this **strength** is not something you must fight to maintain.

It is something **you receive** as you **live in His Presence** and **walk in His Glory.**

DECLARATION

PRAYER

Father God, I thank You that **Your Joy** is my strength. Teach me to **remain aware of Your Presence, so that I can live in the fullness of Your Joy. Help me to guard my joy, and to refuse anything that would disrupt my connection with You. Strengthen me through Your Presence, and renew me when I feel weak. Let Your Joy remain in me, and sustain me, in every situation. I choose to depend on You, and to live in Your Glory. In The Name Of Jesus Christ.**

PRACTICAL APPLICATION

When you face pressure, discouragement, or fatigue, **pause, and return your attention to God.** Do not try to force strength—**reconnect with the source of joy.** Speak Scripture out loud and remind yourself that the joy of The Lord is your strength. Refuse to let circumstances dictate your internal state. **Practice turning your focus back to God throughout the day.** As you do, you will begin to experience a steady **flow of strength**, that comes not from yourself, but from **His Presence** and **His Joy.**

LEARNING TO BE STILL AND ENTER HIS GLORY

The **Glory Life** is not entered through striving—it is entered through **stillness**.

This is one of the greatest paradoxes of the spiritual life. Many attempt to reach God through effort, activity, and constant motion, yet the doorway into deeper awareness of His Presence and the experience of His Glory is not found in doing more—it is found in **becoming still**.

Stillness is not inactivity. It is not passivity. It is not disengagement from life.

Stillness is the intentional quieting of your inner world, so that you can become aware of God.

It is the positioning of your heart and mind **to recognize what is already true**—that God is present, that He is near, and that **His Glory** is available.

Scripture calls you into this reality:

“Be still, and know that I am God...” (Psalm 46:10)

This is not merely a suggestion—it is **an instruction**.

Be still.

Because without stillness, **awareness** is difficult. **And without awareness, you will not enter into the experience of His Presence and Glory.**

The world constantly pulls your attention outward. It fills your mind with noise, urgency, and distractions. It demands reaction. It promotes speed. It trains you to move quickly from one thought to another, from one task to another, without pause.

Your mind will resist stillness. It will attempt to fill the silence with thoughts, concerns, plans, and distractions. It will pull you back into activity and away from **awareness.**

This is why **stillness** must be practiced.

You must train yourself to **quiet your thoughts** and return your attention to God. Not once, but repeatedly—until it becomes **natural.**

This is not something that happens automatically—it is something that is **cultivated.**

As you **practice stillness**, something begins to shift.

Your **awareness** deepens.

Your **focus** sharpens.

Your **connection** strengthens.

You begin to experience what is found in His Presence—not as a concept, but as **a reality.**

“In thy presence is fulness of joy...” (Psalm 16:11)

Stillness positions you to experience this joy.

When your mind is scattered, you are not positioned to receive. When your attention is divided, your **awareness** is weakened. **But when you become still, your attention becomes focused—and in that focus, you begin to experience His Presence more clearly.**

This is why **stillness** is **essential to the Glory Life.**

This is what it means to **enter His Glory**.

Not through effort—but through **awareness**.
Not through striving—but through **stillness**.

And as you learn to be **still**, you will begin to live in a way that is no longer driven by noise, pressure, or distractions—but by the **steady, unchanging reality of God's Presence**.

This is the beginning of **living from His Glory**.

DECLARATION

I choose to be **still**, and know that God is present with me. I quiet my mind and turn my attention to Him. I live **aware of His Presence**, and I enter into **His Glory**. His Presence fills me with joy, and His Joy strengthens me. I am not controlled by distractions—I am anchored in God. I live in His Presence and **His Glory** is my environment. **In The Name Of Jesus Christ**.

PRAYER

Father God, teach me to **be still before You**. Help me to quiet my thoughts and turn my attention to Your Presence. Strengthen my awareness of You and draw me **deeper into Your Glory**. Remove all distractions that pull me away from You, and establish me in a life that is centered on You. **Let Your Presence** become real to me in every moment, and lead me **into a deeper experience of Your Joy and Strength**. **I choose to be still and to live in Your Glory**. **In The Name Of Jesus Christ**.

PRACTICAL APPLICATION

Set aside **intentional moments today** to be still before God. Pause, quiet your thoughts, and **focus your attention on Him**. When distractions arise, gently bring **your focus back to His Presence**. Practice short moments of **stillness throughout your day**, not just in one setting. As you do, you will begin to develop **a deeper awareness of God**. Over time, this awareness will grow stronger, and you will begin to experience His Presence and His Glory in a more consistent and powerful way.

FROM VISITING HIS PRESENCE TO LIVING IN HIS GLORY

There is a vast difference between **visiting God's Presence** and **living in His Glory**.

Many Christian Believers have learned how to visit. They know how to enter moments of prayer, moments of worship, moments where they become aware of God. In those moments, they feel His Nearness, experience His Peace, and sense His Reality.

But when the moment ends, they return to a life that feels separate, distracted, and disconnected.

This cycle has become normal for many.

Moments with God... followed by long stretches without awareness of Him.

But this is not the life you were created for.

You were **not designed to visit God**—you were designed to **live** with Him.

You were not created for occasional encounters—you were created for **continual fellowship** and **constant glory**.

This is the difference between a **visitor** and **one who abides**.

A visitor comes and goes.

One who abides remains.

Jesus revealed this clearly:

“Abide in me, and I in you.” (John 15:4)

Abiding is not an event—it is a **lifestyle**.

It is the continuous state of remaining aware, connected, and aligned with God. It is living in such a way that His Presence is not something you enter into occasionally, but something **you remain in continually**.

This is the **Glory Life**.

To visit His Presence is to step into awareness temporarily.

To live in His Glory is to remain aware continually.

This shift changes everything.

When you only visit His Presence, your experience of God is limited to moments. Your joy rises and falls. Your strength fluctuates. Your awareness comes and goes.

“I am the door: by me if any man enter in, he shall be saved...” (John 10:9)

Entering is the beginning.

Abiding is the life.

Many have entered, but few have learned to remain.

Why?

Because remaining requires alignment.

It requires that your **thoughts**, your **words**, and your **focus** stay connected to God. It requires that you **refuse** what pulls you away, and **embrace** what keeps you **aware**.

This is where many struggle.

Distractions pull attention away.

Circumstances shift focus outward.

Thoughts drift into independence.

And without **intentional realignment**, awareness fades.

But the **Glory Life** is sustained through **continual returning**.

You do not remain by accident—**you remain by choice**.

You choose to return your attention to God.

You choose to align your thoughts with His Word.

You choose to acknowledge Him in every moment.

This is how visiting becomes **living**.

This is why Scripture instructs:

“Pray without ceasing.” (1 Thessalonians 5:17)

This is not a command to speak words nonstop—it is a **call to live in continual awareness of God. It is the posture of a life, that remains connected, aware, and aligned.**

It is the life of **abiding**.

When you **live this way**, something shifts within you.

God is no longer something you turn toward occasionally—He becomes the center of your awareness. His Presence becomes your environment. His Reality becomes your reference point for everything.

This is **living in His Glory**.

It means that **you carry awareness of Him into every moment:**

In your decisions.

In your conversations.

In your work.

In your challenges.

You are no longer stepping in and out—you are **remaining**.

Presence becomes your environment.

And from that environment, **His Glory** becomes your reality.

This is where **life** begins to change at a deeper level.

You are no longer reacting to circumstances—**you are living from God’s Presence**. You are no longer searching for direction—you are living **aware of the One who leads you**. **You are no longer dependent on your own strength—you are drawing from His**.

This is the **life** of one who **abides**.

Jesus Christ revealed the result of this life:

“He that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit.” (John 15:5)

Fruit becomes natural.

Not forced.
Not manufactured.
Not strained.

It flows. Abundantly.

Because the **source** is constant.

This is the **Glory Life**.

Not occasional encounters—but **continual living**.
Not temporary awareness—but **sustained presence**.
Not visiting—but **abiding**.

And this abundant life is available to you.

You do not need to strive to reach it—you need to **choose to remain**.

Return your awareness.
Align your thoughts.
Acknowledge Him continually.

And as you do, you will move from visiting His Presence... **to living in His Glory.**

DECLARATION

I do not visit God's Presence—I **live in His Glory. I abide in Jesus Christ, and His Presence is my continual reality.** I remain aware of God in every moment, and I **align my life with His Word.** His Joy is constant in me, and His Strength sustains me. I refuse to be distracted or disconnected—I **live in His Presence and walk in His Glory every day.** In The Name Of Jesus Christ.

PRAYER

Father God, I thank You that You have not called me to visit Your Presence, but to live in Your Glory. Teach me to abide in You continually, and to **remain aware of You** in every moment. Help me to return my **focus to You when I become distracted, and to align my life with Your Word.** Establish me in a life of constant fellowship with You, and let Your Presence become my environment. Lead me into the fullness of the **Glory Life.** In The Name Of Jesus Christ.

PRACTICAL APPLICATION

Today, begin **to shift your mindset from visiting God to living with Him.** When you notice that your **awareness** has drifted, do not feel discouraged —**simply return your focus to Him.** Practice short, continual acknowledgments of God throughout your day. Speak to Him, think on His Word, and remain aware of His Presence in ordinary moments. As you do this **consistently,** you will begin to move from occasional awareness into continual living—and from visiting His Presence into walking in His Glory.

WHAT PULLS YOU OUT OF THE FLOW OF GOD'S GLORY

The **Glory Life** is not complicated—**but it must be guarded.**

God's Presence is available. His Glory is accessible. His Joy is full, and His Strength is constant. Yet many Believers find themselves moving in and out of this reality, experiencing moments of connection, followed by periods of distance and distraction.

This is not because God has withdrawn.

It is because something has pulled their awareness away from Him.

The flow of God's Glory is not interrupted on His side—it is interrupted on yours, when your attention, your alignment, or your agreement shifts away from Him.

This is why you must understand **what pulls you out of the flow.**

Because what you do not recognize, you cannot resist. And what you do not resist, will continue to disrupt your awareness of God's Presence and your experience of His Glory.

The **Glory Life** is sustained through **awareness** and **alignment**. When those are weakened, the **flow** is **disrupted**.

Scripture reveals the importance of guarding your **heart** and **focus**:

**“Keep thy heart with all diligence; for out of it are the issues of life.”
(Proverbs 4:23)**

Your heart—your inner life, your focus, your attention—is the gateway through which you experience God's Presence and live in **His Glory**. If it is not guarded, it will be influenced by anything that demands your attention.

And this is where the first disruption begins.

Distraction.

Distraction is one of the most subtle and effective ways the flow of God's glory is interrupted. It does not always appear harmful. It often appears

normal, acceptable, even necessary. **But when it captures your attention and pulls it away from God, it weakens your awareness.**

You may still believe in God, but you are no longer **actively aware of Him.**

And when awareness fades, the experience of His Presence becomes distant.

Jesus Christ warned about this condition:

“And take heed to yourselves, lest at any time your hearts be overcharged with... cares of this life...” (Luke 21:34)

The cares of life are not always sinful—but they become **disruptive when they consume your attention and replace your awareness of God.**

This is how **distraction** works.

It does not remove God—it **replaces your focus on Him.**

And when your **focus shifts**, your **alignment** begins to shift as well.

This leads to the next disruption: **misalignment.**

Misalignment occurs when **your thoughts, your words, or your actions** begin to move **out of agreement with God’s Word.**

The **Glory Life** is **sustained by agreement.**

“Can two walk together, except they be agreed?” (Amos 3:3)

Agreement with God is what keeps you walking with Him. **When your thinking aligns with His Truth, when your words agree with His Word, and when your actions follow His Leading, you remain in the flow of His Presence and Glory.**

But when agreement is broken, the flow is disrupted.

This often happens through **thoughts that are not aligned with truth.**

Fear replaces faith.

Doubt replaces trust.

Confusion replaces clarity.

These thoughts do not come from God, but if they are accepted, they begin to influence your words and actions. And when your words begin to speak what is not aligned with God’s Word, you reinforce that misalignment.

This is why your **words matter so deeply.**

They are **not neutral**—they are **directional.**

They either align you with God, or pull you away from Him.

When your words agree with circumstances instead of Scripture, your awareness of God weakens. When your words align with truth, your connection is strengthened.

This is the **constant tension** of the **Glory Life.**

Will you align with what you see, or with what God has said?

What you agree with will determine what you experience.

This leads to another major disruption: **independence.**

Independence is the desire to **live from yourself**, rather than from God.

It is subtle. It often appears as self-reliance, self-sufficiency, or simply handling things on your own without acknowledging God.

But **independence** disconnects you from the **source.**

Jesus Christ made this clear:

“Without me ye can do nothing.” (John 15:5)

When you begin to rely on your own strength, your own understanding, or your own ability, you step out of the flow of His Presence, and into the limitations of yourself.

This is not always obvious at first. You may still function. You may still accomplish tasks. **But the flow of His Glory—the awareness of His Presence, the fullness of His Joy, the strength that comes from Him—begins to diminish.**

Because you are **no longer drawing from Him.**

This is why the **Glory Life** requires **continual dependence.**

Not occasional dependence.

Not situational dependence.

Continual dependence.

Every moment presents a choice:

Will you rely on yourself, or will you return your attention to God?

This brings us to another disruption: **reaction to circumstances.**

When circumstances become your focus, they begin to shape your internal state. You react to what you see instead of responding from awareness of God.

Pressure produces anxiety.

Difficulty produces frustration.

Delay produces discouragement.

And in that reaction, **awareness of God fades.**

But the **Glory Life** calls you to something higher.

“While we look not at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen...” (2 Corinthians 4:18)

This is not denial—it is **alignment.**

You acknowledge what is happening, **but you do not allow it to replace your awareness of God.**

This is how **the flow of His Glory is maintained.**

When your **attention stays on Him**, your internal state is stabilized. Joy remains. Strength continues. Peace is sustained.

But when your attention shifts entirely to circumstances, **that flow is disrupted.**

This is why **guarding your awareness** is essential.

You must recognize what pulls you away and **choose to return.**

Because the **Glory Life** is not about never being distracted—**it is about refusing to remain distracted.**

You will face moments where your focus shifts. You will encounter situations that attempt to pull your attention away. But in those moments, **you have a choice.**

And when you return, the flow is restored.

Because God has not moved.

He is still present.

His Joy is still available.

His Strength is still flowing.

You simply realign.

This is the power of the Glory Life.

It is not fragile—it is **resilient.**

It is not dependent on perfect conditions—it is sustained through **continual alignment.**

And as you learn to recognize what pulls you away, and consistently **return your attention to God**, you will begin to experience a life that is no longer

interrupted—but **steady, consistent, and flowing with His Presence and Glory.**

DECLARATION

I recognize what pulls me away from God, and I refuse to remain distracted. I align my thoughts, my words, and my life with God's Word. I depend on Him continually, and I live aware of His Presence. I do not react to circumstances—I respond from His Truth. The flow of His Glory is active in my life, and I remain in alignment with Him. His joy is my strength, and His Presence is my reality. In The Name Of Jesus Christ.

PRAYER

Father God, I thank You for revealing what disrupts my awareness of You. Help me to recognize distractions, misalignment, and independence when they arise. Teach me to return my attention to You quickly, and to align my life with Your Word. Strengthen me to remain focused on You, and **to live in continual dependence on You. Let Your Presence be my constant awareness, and Your Glory my daily reality. In The Name Of Jesus Christ.**

PRACTICAL APPLICATION

Pay attention today to moments when your **focus shifts away from God.** Notice what is pulling your attention—**distractions, thoughts, pressures, or reactions.** When you recognize it, do not stay there—return your **focus to Him. Speak Scripture aloud** to realign your thinking. Choose to depend **on God, instead of yourself, in decisions and challenges. Practice this consistently, and you will begin to stay in the flow of His Presence, and live in the reality of His Glory.**

BREAKING FREE FROM DISTRACTIONS THAT WEAKEN GLORY AWARENESS

The **Glory Life** is not sustained by desire alone—it is sustained by **focus**.

You may desire to live in God’s Presence. You may long to walk in His Glory. But if your attention is continually pulled away, your awareness will weaken, and your experience of His Presence will fade.

Distraction is not harmless.

It is one of the primary forces that pulls you out of awareness of God, and into a life that feels distant, pressured, and disconnected. It does not always appear dangerous. In fact, it often appears normal. It can be activity, responsibility, information, or even things that seem necessary.

But anything that captures your attention, and replaces your awareness of God, becomes a disruption to the Glory Life.

This is why **breaking free from distraction** is essential.

Because what controls your attention will shape your awareness, and what shapes your awareness will determine how you live.

Scripture gives a direct instruction regarding focus:

“Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on thee: because he trusteth in thee.” (Isaiah 26:3)

Peace is the result of a mind that is stayed—fixed, anchored, focused—on God.

But **distraction pulls your mind away, causing you to lose faith in God, when you fail to demonstrate that you continually love and believe God.**

It divides your attention.

It scatters your focus.

It weakens your awareness.

Faith pleases God, but lack of awareness and trust causes sin to separate you from God's Presence, **because you fail to respond to God properly.**

And when your mind is no longer stayed on God, peace is replaced by pressure, clarity is replaced by confusion, and strength begins to fade.

This is how subtle **distraction** can be.

It does not remove God—**it replaces your focus on Him.**

And when your focus is replaced, your **awareness** is weakened.

This is why Jesus Christ gave this warning:

“No man can serve two masters...” (Matthew 6:24)

You cannot give your full attention to God while also allowing your attention to be controlled by everything else. Your focus must be directed. It must be guarded. It must be intentional.

Because your focus determines your flow.

If your attention is fixed on God, you remain in the flow of His Presence and Glory. If your attention is scattered, **you drift out of that awareness.**

This is not because God has moved—it is because your **focus** has shifted.

This is why breaking free from distraction requires more than recognition—**it requires discipline.**

You must choose what you give your attention to.

Not everything deserves your focus.

Not everything requires your mental energy.

Not everything should be allowed to occupy your thoughts.

If it weakens your awareness of God, it must be addressed.

REPENTANCE THAT RESTORES YOU TO THE GLORY

Speak Scripture out loud, and align your thinking with truth. Make a conscious decision to agree with God in every situation, regardless of what you see. As you practice this consistently, **you will begin to experience a greater flow** of His Presence, and **see His Glory manifested in your life**.

RENEWING YOUR MIND TO STAY IN THE GLORY

The Glory Life is sustained through alignment—and alignment is established in the mind.

If your mind is **not aligned** with God’s Word, your awareness will drift, your words will follow, and your experience of His Presence will weaken. **But when your mind is renewed—when it is brought into agreement with God—your awareness stabilizes, your words align, and you remain in the flow of His Glory.**

This is why **renewing your mind** is not optional.

Throughout the day, return your mind **to God intentionally.** **As you practice this consistently, your thinking will become renewed, your awareness will increase, and you will remain in the flow of His Presence and Glory.**

SPEAKING WORDS THAT CARRY AND RELEASE GLORY

ABIDING IN JESUS CHRIST AS A LIFE IN HIS GLORY

The **Glory Life** is not sustained by moments—it is sustained **by abiding**.

Many have learned how to approach God, how to seek Him, how to enter moments of **awareness**. But the life you were created for is not built on approaching—it is built on **remaining**.

Abiding is the difference between visiting His Presence and **living in His Glory**.

But it must be sustained through awareness and faith.

LIVING ABOVE CIRCUMSTANCES THROUGH THE GLORY

The **Glory Life** does not remove circumstances—it **lifts you above them**.

Many believe that living in God's Presence means a life without difficulty, pressure, or challenge. But the reality is not the absence of circumstances—it is **the presence of God within them** that changes everything.

You may still face challenges.

You may still encounter pressure.

You may still walk through situations that test your focus.

But you are no longer under those circumstances.

You live above them.

Not because of your strength—but because of His Presence and His Glory.

This is the defining difference of the **Glory Life**.

You are not controlled by what is happening around you—you are anchored in what is happening within you.

- Your awareness becomes clear
- Your faith becomes strong

And **His Glory** flows.

WHY AGREEMENT RELEASES GLORY

God’s Glory is not created—it is **revealed**.

COMMON BLOCKERS TO LIVING IN GOD'S GLORY

IDENTIFYING AND OVERCOMING WHAT INTERRUPTS ALIGNMENT

The **Glory Life** is available—but it is often **resisted**.

Not because God withholds His Presence.

Not because His Glory is distant.

But because **alignment is interrupted**.

This appendix reveals the most common blockers that prevent Christian Believers from living continually in God's Presence and Glory—and how to overcome them.

BLOCKER 1: DISTRACTION

Distraction is the most subtle and most common interruption.

It does not appear dangerous.

It does not feel like rebellion.

But it pulls your **awareness away from God**.

Your attention shifts.

Your focus drifts.

BLOCKER 3: MISALIGNED THINKING

If your thoughts align with fear, doubt, or limitation—you move out of agreement.

BLOCKER 10: PARTIAL SURRENDER

You cannot live in full glory with partial surrender.

THE CORE PRINCIPLE

Every blocker leads to one issue:

Loss of alignment.

Every solution leads to one action:

THE RESTORATION FLOW

Recognize → Realign → Reaffirm → Remain

This is how you overcome every blocker.

THE TRUTH YOU MUST REMEMBER

God has not moved.

His Presence is still with you.

His Glory is still available.

You simply return.

DECLARATION

I recognize what interrupts my alignment, and I return to God immediately. I do not remain distracted or misaligned. I align my thoughts, my words, and my life with God's Word. I walk by faith, I depend on Him, and I live in His Presence continually. His Glory flows through my life without interruption. In The Name Of Jesus Christ.

PRAYER

Father God, reveal anything in my life that interrupts alignment with You. Help me to recognize distractions, misalignment, and self-reliance quickly. Teach me to return to You immediately and to remain

in Your Presence. Strengthen me to live in full alignment so that Your Glory can flow through my life continually. In The Name Of Jesus Christ.

PRACTICAL ACTIVATION

Today, **identify one blocker** that appears in your life most often.

Focus on correcting it immediately.

Do not try to fix everything at once.

Start with one.

Practice returning to alignment.

And remain there.

PRAYERS FOR LIVING IN GOD'S GLORY

ALIGNING YOUR HEART, WORDS, AND LIFE WITH HIS PRESENCE DAILY

Prayer is not meant to bring God near.

He is already near.

Prayer aligns you with Him.

It restores awareness, strengthens faith, and establishes agreement. It is how you intentionally position your heart, your thoughts, and your words in alignment with God, so that His Presence and **Glory can be experienced continually.**

These prayers are designed to be used **daily.**

Pray them slowly.

Pray them with intention.

Pray them **in faith.**

Let them shape your life in God's Presence.

MORNING PRAYER OF ALIGNMENT

Father God, I thank You that You are with me and that You are in me. I begin this day aware of Your Presence. I align my thoughts, my words, and my life with Your Word. I do not rely on myself—I depend on You completely. Let Your Presence be real to me in every moment. Let Your Glory be revealed through my life today. I choose to walk in agreement with You from the beginning of this day. In The Name Of Jesus Christ.

PRAYER OF AWARENESS

Father God, help me to remain aware of You. When my focus shifts, draw me back to You quickly. Let my heart stay anchored in Your Presence. Teach me to live continually aware that You are with me and in me. Let Your Presence become my constant reality. In The Name Of Jesus Christ.

PRAYER OF ALIGNMENT WITH GOD'S WORD

Father God, align my thinking with Your Truth. Remove every thought that does not agree with Your Word. Help me to think in alignment with You, and to reject anything that contradicts Your Truth. Let my mind be renewed and established in Your Word. In The Name Of Jesus Christ.

PRAYER OF SPEECH AND AGREEMENT

Father God, place a guard over my mouth. Let my words align with Your Word. Help me to speak life, truth, and faith in every situation. I refuse to speak fear or doubt. PRAYER TO LIVE IN GOD'S GLORY CONTINUALLY

Father God, establish me in a life that remains in Your Presence continually. Let my awareness of You never fade. Align me fully with Your Word. Strengthen my faith, guide my thoughts, and direct my words. Let my life reflect Your Glory in every moment. Teach me to live unbroken in Your Presence. In The Name Of Jesus Christ.

HOW TO USE THESE PRAYERS

Use these prayers **daily**.

Morning and evening.

In moments of distraction.

In times of need.

Let them become part of your life.

DECLARATION

I live in alignment with God through prayer. My heart is aligned, my thoughts are aligned, and my life is aligned. I remain aware of His Presence, and His Glory flows through my life continually. In The Name Of Jesus Christ.

PRACTICAL ACTIVATION

Choose **at least two** of these **prayers** and pray them every day for the **next seven days**.

Then expand to more.

Let prayer become your continual alignment with God.

WALKING IN THE SPIRIT DAILY

LIVING CONTINUALLY LED, EMPOWERED, AND SUSTAINED BY GOD

The **Glory Life** and **walking in the Spirit** are not separate—they are the same life expressed in different ways.

To live in God's Glory is to live aware of His Presence.

To walk in the Spirit is to live directed by His Presence.

One emphasizes awareness.

The other emphasizes movement.

Together, they form the complete life you are called to live.

THE COMMAND TO WALK IN THE SPIRIT

Scripture gives a direct instruction:

“This I say then, Walk in the Spirit, and ye shall not fulfil the lust of the flesh.” (Galatians 5:16)

This is not a suggestion.

It is the way of life for every Christian Believer.

To walk in the Spirit means to live continually aware of God, and to respond to His Leading, instead of reacting from your own nature.

WHAT IT MEANS TO WALK IN THE SPIRIT

Walking in the Spirit is:

- Living aware of God's Presence
- Being led by His Spirit
- Aligning your thoughts with His Word
- Speaking in agreement with Him

It is lived moment by moment, and it is practical.

THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN FLESH AND SPIRIT

The flesh represents self-reliance.

- Thinking independently
- Reacting emotionally
- Acting without dependence on God

The Spirit represents alignment with God.

- Thinking according to His Word
- Responding from His Presence
